McGill Redmen Preview for 2008 CIS Cavendish University Cup

Founded in 1877, the McGill University Redmen are the world's oldest existing hockey team.

In this, their 133rd season, they finished second in the OUA Far East at 18-8-2 and enter the CIS tournament for the third time in three years, with an overall record of 26-16-0.

McGill enters this CIS tournament with a 6-2 post-season record after winning the OUA East conference quarterfinal series 2-1 against Ottawa, sweeping the conference semifinal series 2-0 vs. Toronto and sweeping the OUA East championship series 2-0 vs. UQTR before losing 2-1 to Western in the Queen's Cup league title game.

The Redmen are composed of six seniors, five juniors, three sophomores and 13 freshmen. They are guided by **Martin Raymond**, a former All-Canadian forward at McGill, who has a 292-189-35 coaching record in 14 seasons behind the bench.

After losing their first five games (0-4-1) the Redmen caught fire in the second half of the campaign, winning 18 of their last 23 conference duels (18-4-1) before reaching the OUA final.

"It's our third appearance in four years at the Nationals and we're as hungry as can be," says coach **Martin Raymond**. "We're very young but have a group of strong skaters who move the puck well. We are a bit under-sized so we have to take advantage of our speed to counteract the larger, more experienced teams."

"It looks like the competition in this tournament will be as fierce as ever, so we will need to commit to solid defence and get strong goaltending in order to give ourselves a chance."

- McGill's hockey team was founded in Jan. 1877 and was the first organized hockey team in the world. the team is in its 133rd season.

- The team's lifetime playoff record is 46-66 with 371 goals for and 423 goals against.

- That record is a little misleading as it was extremely poor (5-27) from 1910 to 1987. Since joining the OUA in 1987-88, the Redmen have registered a 41-39 record, including an impressive 14-3 post-season record in the last two years.

- this year's edition of the Redmen was supposed to be in a rebuilding mode with the loss of nine seniors and a key freshman from last year's Queen's Cup-winning team, which marked their first league title since 1946... With a lineup that features 14 newcomers, including 13 freshmen, the Redmen got off to a poor start, posting a 2-4 pre-season record and an 0-5 mark in regular-season play. Since then, they racked up an 18-5 record to climb out of last place in the OUA Far East on Jan. 24 and finish second to UQTR. They have continued their winning ways in the playoffs, posting a 6-2 record en route to beating Ottawa (2-1) and sweeping both Toronto (2-

0) and first-place UQTR (2-0), before losing 2-1 at Western in the OUA championship game...

- most of the turnaround can be attribute to a strong recruiting class, which has resulted in nine freshman playing key roles, mixed in with some strong leadership from co-captains **Ken Morin** and **Eric L'Italien**, and a great coaching staff.

- Head coach **Martin Raymond**, in his 14th season as bench boss of the Redmen, is the OUA East coach of the year. A native of Pierrefonds, Que., who now resides in Ste-Basile-le-Grande on the south shore of Montreal, guided the Redmen to an 18-8-2 record despite losing nine veterans from last year's league championship team. Raymond's troop upset UQTR to capture the OUA East Conference title and a berth in the OUA Queen's Cup final in London (a 2-1 loss to Western). They also qualified for the CIS championship tournament in Thunder Bay, Ont., March 26-29.

- Among the key recruits is centre **Alex Picard-Hooper**, who had a 137-186-323 record in 265 games over four seasons in the QMJHL. Picard-Hooper hasn't missed a beat and led the Redmen in scoring with 10-26-36 in 28 regular-season games, the top-scoring freshman in the OUA. He also leads the OUA in playoff scoring with 5-6-11 in eight games. Picard-Hooper received the conference rookie-of-the-year nomination, earned all-rookie honours and was a second-team all-star.

- another key recruit was **Marc-Andre Dorion**, a rearguard, who was an all-star in the QMJHL last year and was invited to the NHL's Dallas Stars rookie camp last September. He earned a berth on the OUA all-rookie team.

- **Eric L'Italien**, a fifth-year right winger and co-captain, is the OUA East nominee for the Randy Gregg trophy, presented to the CIS player who best combines academics with hockey and community service. A solid two-way player who is arguably the fastest skater in the league, L'Italien earned 13 points in 17 regular season games. An Academic All-Canadian and second-year law student, he volunteers with the Montreal police force and other organizations to promote the importance of combining school and sports with youth groups. He also offers his time for

- **Ken Morin**, also a co-captain and a defensive stalwart on the blueline, earned second-team all-star status. He tallied 13 points, including three goals – two of them game-winners.

- **Sam Bloom**, who tied for the team league in goals with 14 and was second among Redmen scoring leaders with 34 points in 16 contests, also earned OUA second-team all-conference honours.

History of the McGill Hockey Program:

- McGill is the world's first organized hockey team and played its first game on Jan. 31, 1877, a 2-1 win against members of the old Victoria Skating Rink in Montreal.
- McGill is in the midst of its **133rd season** and seeking its first CIS national title, which would be the team's 27th championship overall, including 14 Queen's Cup titles.
- Some **14 McGill players have won the Stanley Cup** a combined total of 35 times. A dozen members of the McGill team have gone on to be inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame, including hockey pioneers **Frank** and **Lester Patrick**, plus broadcaster **Dick Irvin** and NHL administrator **Brian O'Neill**. Two former McGill players in the Hall of Fame have been trustees for the Stanley Cup (**Philip D. Ross** and **Brian O'Neill**)
- McGill has produced 10 players who have gone onto play in the NHL, the fourth-highest total of any CIS team. The list includes two Calder trophy winners as NHL rookie of the year (F **Russ Blinco**, 1933-34 with the Montreal Maroons; and G **Jack Gelineau** with the Boston Bruins in 1949-50). The last McGill player to make the NHL was LW **Mathieu Darche**, who played for Columbus (2000-03), Nashville (2003-04), San Jose (2006-07) and is currently playing with the Tampa Bay Lightning.
- The oldest McGill record that still stands, dates back over a century. On Feb. 10, 1905 **Dunny MacCallum** set a single-game scoring mark

with eight goals in a 14-2 win against the Toronto Varsity Blues. Since then those closest a McGill player has come to that record is seven goals by future NHL player **Reggie Sinclair**, who had a 7-3-10 performance in a 13-6 win over Harvard on Feb. 22, 1939... Four others have scored six in a game and three of them occurred in years that end in the number six: **W. Chambers** (1906), **Billy Wilson** (1912), **Mark Reade** (1986) and **Pierre Gendron** (1996)... There are still a few games left for someone to accomplish that feat in 2008!

- The Redmen have been ranked in the CIS **Top 10 poll for nine of 15 ranking periods** this season. After not making the Top 10 in the first five weeks, the Redmen were 9th, 10th, 9th, 9th, 10th, 10th, 10th, 10th and 10th. They are currently seeded third of the six teams in the CIS tournament.

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS: McGill is attempting to win their their **27th championship overall**, which is better than the Montreal Canadiens (who have won 24 Stanley Cups since their inception in 1909), for Montreal hockey supremacy... The Redmen have captured 14 Queen's Cup titles -- the second highest total next to Toronto's 41 -- winning the inaugural Cup in 1903, followed by championships in 1905, 1912, 1930, 1931, 1933, 1935, 1936, 1937, 1938, 1939, 1946 and 2008... McGill has also won **12 other championships** in various leagues, including **one** in the 1883 Montreal Winter Carnival tournament, **two** in the Montreal City Hockey League (1918, 1921), **two** in the Quebec Amateur Hockey Association (1918, 1921), **two** in the Quebec Senior Hockey League (1931, 1934), **three** in the International Intercollegiate Ice Hockey League (1937, 1938, 1939) and two OUA East Conference titles.

THE NEXT TO LAST DANCE: Prior to winning the Queen's Cup last year, McGill's last men's hockey championship team was the 1945-46 Redmen, which won their 13th Queen's Cup title in the old Senior Intercollegiate Hockey League... Under the guidance of coach **Dave Campbell**, that McGill squad posted a **13-2-0 record overall**, outscoring opponents 120-52 for an average score of 8-4... The Redmen started the season with 10 consecutive victories, equalling a McGill record which still stands... They established another

school record (which still stands), for most goals in a game, with a **20-4 exhibition victory over the Lachute Hockey Club**... In the six-game regular season schedule, McGill's only loss was to the Toronto Varsity Blues... To have a chance at the Queen's Cup, the Redmen needed to win their final regular season game against the undefeated and division-leading Blues... A loss would have ended the season for McGill, while a victory would result in both teams being tied for first with a 5-1-0 record and force a playoff... McGill fell behind 4-1 after two periods but rallied in the final stanza to win 5-4... This miraculous victory forced a sudden-death playoff game for the Queen's Cup at a jam-packed Montreal Forum on March 15, 1946, which McGill won 4-1... Three players from that Redmen team went on to future NHL careers, including **Jack Gelineau** (four seasons with Boston & Chicago; won the Calder trophy), plus right wingers **Reggie Sinclair** (three seasons with NY Rangers and Detroit) and **Johnny Peirson** (11 seasons with Boston)... Other team members included back-up netminder **Dick Currie** and defencemen **Bob Brodrick** (captain), **Doug Heron**, **Gordie "Goose" Gosselin**, **Cy Biegler**, **Walter Mingie** (spare) and **Tom Bridel** (spare). The forwards included **Tom Hale**, **George Hale**, **Jack Millar**, **Jimmy O'Connor**, **Dan Porteous**, **Ernie Spiller** and **Ward Pitfield**. The support staff included **Allan Rae** (manager), **Frank Rogers** (asst. manager), **Harry Grimes** (trainer), **Dr. Fred Tees** (team physician) and **Dave Campbell** (head coach)...

ORIGIN OF THE NAME REDMEN: A look into the history of the nickname "Redmen" reveals that it was first used in 1927 and was originally written as two words (i.e. "Red Men"), in reference to the red school colours and red jerseys worn by McGill teams.

"In ancient times, Celts were known as the Red Men because of their hair... our own Red Men were no doubt Celts in honour of James McGill's Scottish descent," says McGill historian **Dr. Stanley Frost**...

WASN'T THAT A PARTY?: The McGill men's hockey team, in their 133rd season, officially turned 132 years old on January 31, 2009. Students from the Montreal-based university were instrumental in the origins and development of hockey. They founded the world's first organized hockey club and played their first game on Jan. 31, 1877, according to an article published in the Feb. 1, 1877 edition of the now defunct McGill University Gazette.

That first contest was a challenge game played between McGill and the "Victorias" -- an amalgamation of members of Montreal's old Victoria Skating Rink, bolstered with players from the Montreal Lacrosse Club and the Montreal Football Club. The historic game, which ended in a 2-1 victory for McGill, was played at the Victoria Rink, bordered by Drummond Street, Boulevard de Maisonneuve and Dorchester Street (now Boulevard René Levesque). A National car rental agency is currently in that location.

That 1877 McGill team was founded two years after the first organized game was played -- one involving a number of McGill students -- on March 3, 1875 at the Victoria rink. One of the captains in that game was James Creighton, a native of Halifax who went on to study law at McGill, graduating in 1878. Creighton and a number of his McGill classmates, namely Henry Joseph, Richard F. Smith, W.F. Robertson and W.L. Murray, all played an instrumental role in developing the rules for ice hockey. McGill's first organized game, on Jan. 31, 1877, was a 2-1 win over the members of the Victoria Skating Rink and was played under rules that were eventually published in *The (Montreal) Gazette* on Feb. 27, 1877.

There is sufficient evidence to indicate that McGill students were instrumental in subsequent revisions of the rules in 1879 and 1886. McGill students were: the first to wear uniforms in a game, use standardized goal areas, utilize referees, pose for a team photo (1881), the first to be photographed in action during a game (1884) and the first to win a championship trophy (1883 Montreal Winter Carnival Cup). The McGill club was part of the first organized hockey league (1886) and was instrumental in organizing (and winning) the first intercollegiate league (1903).

In the early 1970s, McGill was one of 11 universities in the province of Quebec that had an intercollegiate hockey team representing the university. But by 1986, that number had dwindled to only three Quebec universities willing to maintain a varsity hockey team.

As a result, the Quebec university league folded and the three Quebec teams were permitted to play in the Ontario University Athletics conference, which currently is comprised of 16 teams spread over four geographically-based divisions. Since joining the OUA in 1987-88, McGill has posted the fourth-highest winning percentage (.633) with 268 wins, 147 losses and 46 ties

in 461 regular-season games. The only teams with a better winning percentage have been UQTR (.780), Western (.751) and Lakehead (.675).

McGILL MEMENTOS: McGill University, founded in 1821, has an enrolment of 21,000 full-time students and 49 different intercollegiate sports teams... McGill assisted in the founding of three other universities: Victoria, U.B.C. and **Alberta**... The University is named for the Hon. James McGill, a fur trader and leading Montreal merchant who died in 1813... He bequeathed his Burnside Palace estate and £10,000 towards the establishment of a "Royal Institute for the Advancement of Learning"... In 1821 the institution received its first Royal Charter from King George IV and McGill College was founded... Classes began in 1829 when an existing medical college was incorporated into McGill... In 1872, McGill formed a football club which, two years later, met Harvard in the first "North American-style" football game... In 1877, McGill students formed the world's first organized hockey club... In 1884, women were first admitted to McGill... In 1891, McGill graduate James Naismith invented the game of basketball... In 1898, the men's intercollegiate soccer program began... In 1922-23, the women's intercollegiate basketball program began... Some other notable McGill graduates include: Conrad Black, Leonard Cohen, Ken Dryden, Dick Irvin, Jr., Sir Wilfrid Laurier, Frank and Lester Patrick, Pierre Péladeau, Richard Pound, William Shatner, Michael Soles, Larry Smith, Randy Chevrier (Dallas Cowboys, Cincinnati Bengals, Edmonton Eskimos, Calgary Stampeders), J.P. Darche of the NFL's Seattle Seahawks and Mike Babcock, current coach of the NHL's Detroit Red Wings.

McGILL COAT OF ARMS: The University's coat of arms was derived from an armorial device assumed by James McGill. It include three red Martlets on a silver field. At the top of the shield is an open book — the heraldic symbol of an institution of learning. It bears the words *In Domino Confido*, James McGill's motto which translates into the phrase "I trust in the Lord". Silver crowns on either side of the book refer to Montreal's royal name and the inclusion of a fleur-de-lys is a reminder of the city's French origin. Montreal's three peaks of Mt. Royal are represented by three peaks above the Martlets in the coat of arms... The patent was granted by England's College of Arms in 1922 and registered in 1956 with the Lord Lyon, King of Arms in Scotland. On June 12, 1992, the patent was registered with the Public Register of Arms, Flags and Badges of Canada.
