Golden Bears 2009 University Cup Preview

The University of Alberta Golden Bears (22-4-2 Canada West, 31-10 overall) return to the University Cup for the 12th time in the last 13 seasons.

Alberta is making a record 33rd appearance overall at the CIS men's hockey championship and is searching for their 14th national title, also a CIS record, and their fourth in the last five years. The Bears are the lone representative from the Canada West conference after claiming their 47th Canada West banner in an impressive two-game sweep over the Saskatchewan Huskies.

The Season:

Alberta played five of their first six conference games on the road after a pre-season that saw them play straight road games with a record of 2-3. The Bears picked up road wins over the Manitoba Bisons and Saskatchewan Huskies and losses in Colorado to the University of Denver Pioneers, the Air Force Academy Falcons and the Colorado College Tigers.

After a 4-2 start to the regular season, the Golden Bears rolled off eight straight conference wins before the Christmas break and then another six straight victories to start the second half of the season. They closed out the regular season campaign by going 5-3 and clinching first place.

Fourth-Year Head Coach Eric Thurston guided the Golden Bears to a 22-4-2 record that finished atop the Canada West standings with picked up a CIS-best 46 points. They tied for the nation's lead in wins (22), allowed a CIS-low 63 goals, were first in the Canada West and fifth in the country with 120 goals scored, and led the first 13 national media polls of the campaign before dropping to second place in the final rankings.

After a three-week lay-off the Bears struggled out of the playoff gate, losing their opening game to the Regina Cougars at home, their first loss in the opening round of the playoffs since 1996-97. Alberta rebounded nicely to win games two and three, out-scoring the Cougars 11-2 along the way.

The Golden Bears then met the Saskatchewan Huskies in Canada West Final, for the eighth consecutive season.

Alberta made short work of Saskatchewan winning 5-2 and 7-0 in a surprisingly lop-sided series as the Golden Bears claimed their 47th Canada West title in 73 seasons, and eighth in the last nine seasons.

Players to Watch:

Canada West First Team goaltender **Aaron Sorochan** who has already won two titles with Alberta (2006 and 2008) and was the CIS Rookie of the Year in 2006. Sorochan led all CIS goaltenders with a 1.66 goals-against average and a .937 save percentage while compiling a 15-3-0 record in 18 games for Alberta, despite suffering an ankle injury in the opening game of the conference schedule. The fourth-year netminder missed all but 20 minutes of the Golden Bears' first six Canada West Hockey games due to the injury but returned to the lineup to backstop Alberta to the lowest team goals-against average in the CIS, allowing only 63 goals against for a 2.25 goals-against average.

Kyle Fecho was named the Canada West Best Defenceman leading the conference in goals and finishing fourth in points with 7-8-15 in 26 games. He was also a member of the 2006-07 All-Freshman Team.

Ben Kilgour, a First-Team Conference All-Star in 2006-07, a former CIS Tournament All-Star, Team Canada's Captain at the 2009 Winter Universiade and owner of three University Cup rings is the glue of the Alberta forwards, while **Chad Klassen** and **Derek Ryan** are the scoring leaders. Klassen, who notched 91 points with the Spokane Chiefs, led Alberta in scoring with 37 points while linemate Ryan banked 35. The pair have already picked up 13 combined points in the playoffs, with **Brian Woolger** completing the line and adding four post-season points.

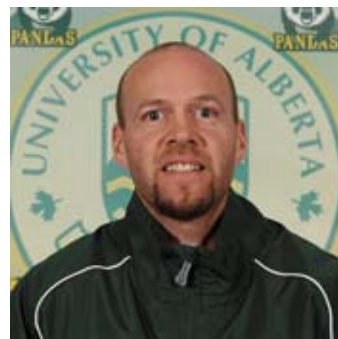

100 Years of Golden Bears Ice Hockey History

The 2008-09 season is Alberta's 96th year of hockey action and 101st year of existence.

Where to begin? The success experienced by the U of A men's hockey program since the school was formed back in 1908 is astonishing.

The Golden Bears picked up a record-setting 13th University Cup championship with a 3-2 win over UNB at Moncton in March 2008, despite losing their opening game in overtime, breaking the jinx that seemed to plague teams flying into to play the event. Ian McDonald picked up a hat-trick against McGill in Alberta's second game and scored the tournament-winner against the defending champion Varsity Reds to claim MVP, while Harlan Anderson had a stellar event and was also named to the All-Tournament team. Anderson was selected as a CIS First Team All-Canadian and Eric Hunter made the All-Rookie squad. Anderson went on to play pro for Springfield of the AHL immediately following the event.

This came after claiming a record 46th Canada West title in 2008, and helped the Bears to a third University Cup title in four years, after taking back-to-back championships as host in 2005 and 2006.. Alberta has won 13 of 17 appearances in the gold medal game.

The team has racked up 32 appearances at the University Cup, the annual tournament held since 1962-63 to determine the best university hockey team in Canada, the latest being the 2008 edition in Moncton.

Early stars for the Golden Bears include two-time Wilson Challenge Trophy winner (1939 & 1940) as the University of Alberta's Top Male Athlete, Dave MacKay. MacKay was the first Alberta hockey star to go to play in the National Hockey League, as he scored three goals in 27 games for the 1940-41 Chicago Black Hawks.

Overall there have been 13 former members of the Alberta Golden Bears to play in the NHL and one of those – Dean Clark – actually played for Alberta a few years after a stint with the Edmonton Oilers.

The Golden Bears hockey team has won a combined 46 WCIAA/Canada West conference championships in 72 seasons, with a sheer dominance of the sport from 1933-34 to 1950-51, a time during which they won every conference title possible, with several years abandoned altogether due to World War II. The Bears won six straight CW titles from 2000-01 to 2005-06.

Clare Drake is the team's – and possible the school's - biggest sports legend. Coach Drake, who still lives in Edmonton, actually played his university hockey with the UBC Thunderbirds until 1951, but graduated, got married and moved to Edmonton, where he played one last year of competitive hockey and led the Golden Bears to a title. Then in 1955, while teaching at Strathcona High School, he became interim coach for the Bears and led them to the 1956 title.

In 1958 Drake took permanent – and we do mean PERMANENT – control of the team. From 1958 to 1988-89, save for 1975-76 when Leon Abbott took over while Drake had a brief stint as coach of the WHA Edmonton Oilers and 1979-80, 1983-84 when Bill Moores assumed temporary duties. Drake's final coaching numbers: 697-296-37 (.695). He was named CIAU Coach of the Year twice and Canada West Coach of the Year four times. His most notable honour came in 1989 when he was elected to the Canadian Sports Hall of Fame. On June 1, 1990 the U of A dedicated Varsity Arena, the school's hockey rink, to Drake and renamed it Clare Drake Arena. A large tribute banner now hangs on the wall in the arena.

Moores guided the team to gold in 1980 and a bronze medal in 1984. Once he took full control as head coach, Moores helped the Golden Bears to three Canada West titles and one University Cup from 1989-90 to 1993-94, accumulating an impressive 219-78-33 (.712) over seven seasons.

Peter Esdale had a less-than-successful campaign as head coach in 1994-95. With a 15-16-5 overall mark, it marks the only time since Canada West was formed in 1972 that they did not finish above .500 overall.

In the summer of 1995 Rob Daum, fresh off two years as head coach of the Western Hockey League's Lethbridge Hurricanes, arrived in Edmonton to coach Alberta, and the team has been better for it ever since. In 10 seasons since he took over, the Bears compiled a 345-79-32 (.792) overall record and an astonishing 218-37-25 (.825) conference record. Alberta won three University Cup championships, six Canada West finals and attended nine straight national tournaments from 1997 to 2005 under the leadership of the Churchbridge, SK native.

After falling short as the #1 seed in four straight Tournament appearances from 2001 to 2004, Daum and the Golden won the CIS title at home on March 28, 2005 before 10,331 fans at Rexall Place in Edmonton. Ben Thomson scored the tying goal with 23 seconds left and the winner at 5:27 of OT. Thomson was tournament MVP, while Jeff Zorn and Ben Kilgour were also named to the All-Tournament team. First-year goalie BJ Boxma won the semifinal and final.

The 2005-06 season began with early news when 10-year Head Coach Rob Daum resigned to take the head coaching position with the Houston Aeros, AHL affiliate of the NHL's Minnesota Wild, and after two seasons he moved on to become an assistant with the Edmonton Oilers in 2007-08.

It was then that 11-year Assistant Coach and former Golden Bears forward Eric Thurston stepped in to succeed Daum. The 05-06 Bears posted the best record in CW at 21-5-2, then went on to sweep Calgary and Saskatchewan in the playoffs to become the #1 seed at Nationals in front of the hometown fans once again. At the University Cup they handled Laurier (8-2) and McGill (5-1) with ease and came back to defeat Lakehead 3-2 in the final before 7,615 fans at Rexall Place. Defenceman Harlan Anderson was named Tournament MVP, while Chris Ovington, tournament scoring leader Dylan Stanley and perennial All-Star Ben Thomson made the All-Tournament team. Days later Ovington signed a tryout contract with Rob Daum and the AHL's Houston Aeros.

In 2006-07 only one team qualified from Canada West for the national championship, and despite another terrific conference season and home ice advantage, the Golden Bears fell in three games to Saskatchewan at the conference final, meaning that, for the first time in 11 seasons, they did not qualify for the University Cup. Aaron Sorochan and Ben Kilgour were First Team All-Canadians, while Harlan Anderson made the Second Team. Dylan Stanley was also a First Team All-Star, while Ian McDonald, Kyle Fecho and Dale Mahovsky made the Canada West All-Freshman team.

The 2007-08 roster was loaded with talent at every position, both veteran and freshman. Harlan Anderson was named conference MVP and Defenceman of the Year, while Eric Hunter was selected top rookie. Second team all-conference goalie Aaron Sorochan was again solid between the pipes, while Jason Fransoo (all-rookie) and Ian McDonald (CIS Tournament MVP, CW Second Team) were also impressive, standout players.
