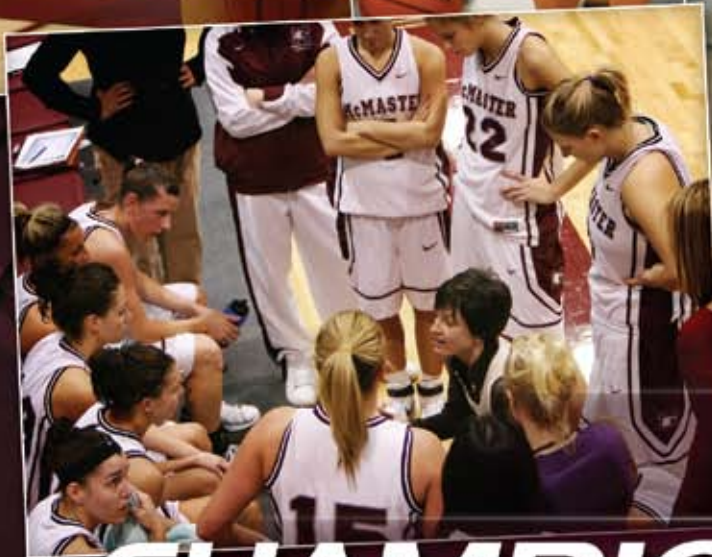
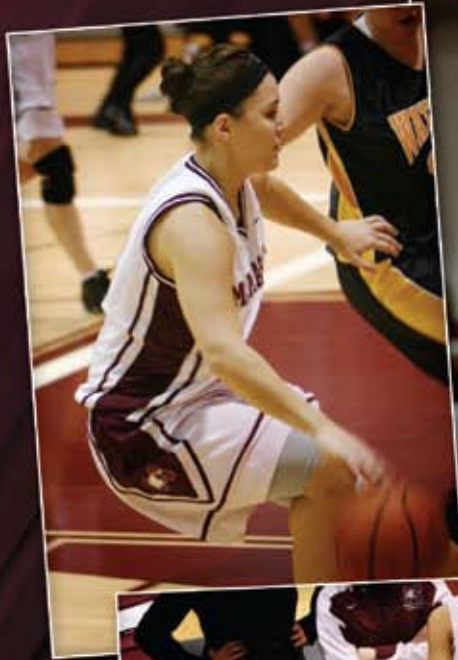

## 2007-2008 SEASON REVIEW

The Marauders are geared up for their seventh National Championship tournament appearance on the heels of another dominant season in which they captured their second OUA title in the last three years and fourth banner overall. For the second straight year McMaster posted a 21-1 conference record to finish on top of the OUA West. They did so with a league best scoring differential of +481 on their way to a season high 17 game win streak. In her sixteenth season with the Marauders head coach Theresa Burns was selected as the OUA West Coach of Year for second time in as many years. She led the team to their 3rd consecutive OUA West Championship. Lindsay DeGroot was named the OUA West player of the year and a first team all star for the second straight year. The talented guard from Thedford, ON has quickly become a staple of a deep Marauders basketball team that began the season ranked #4 in the country and have since ascended to the #2 spot. She became only the second Marauder in history to become a first team All-Canadian and is expected to continue to lead her squad this time around. DeGroot finished near the top of the league leaders in nearly all statistical categories. She was third in the OUA with an average of 18.9 points per game while amassing 171 rebounds. Another driving force behind the Marauders success has been 2007-08 OUA West Defensive Player of the Year recipient Rachel Hart who helped McMaster limit their opponents to an average of just 47.5 points per game. The 5'8" guard has distinguished herself as a standout player who is regularly matched up against the oppositions best players while still collecting 53 steals. Her 1.51 assists to turnover ratio was second in the OUA. Look to OUA First Team all star point guard Taylor Smith to facilitate the offense of the OUA's most accurate field goal shooters (42.6 per cent). Her 86 assists (4.3 per game) tied her for the league lead.

### FAST BREAK FACTS

**THINK PINK:** On January 30th the Marauder players wore pink shoe laces for their CIS "Hoops for a Cure" event to raise awareness and funds for the Canadian Breast Cancer Foundation. The Marauders continue to wear their pink shoe laces to honour head coach Theresa Burns who is a Breast Cancer survivor.

**THE COACH:** Coach Burns won her second consecutive OUA West Coach of the Year award this season. It was her third in the last seven seasons.

**COMMON GROUND:** The Marauders are a tightly knit group with five players all hailing from the same high school. Rewi, Hart, Critchley, Chiarot, and te Boekhorst all graduated from St. Mary's in Hamilton, ON. Rocca and DeGroot both come from St. Christopher's high school in Sarnia, ON where the Marauders have played an annual preseason game the last three seasons. Taylor Smith and Amanda D'Ortenzio were both members of the St. Thomas More squad that won gold at the 2004 OFSAA AAAA Championships. Eight players hail from the Hamilton Area.

**STAR WATCH:** McMaster led the OUA with three major award winners. Lindsay DeGroot was named the OUA West Player of the year for the second straight season. Rachel Hart was selected the OUA West Defensive Player of the year. Coach Theresa Burns

received OUA West Coach of the Year.

**SISTERS.....ALMOST:** Guards Taylor Smith and Amanda D'Ortenzio have been playing together since the third grade.

**HOT STREAK:** The Marauders are on a 7 game win streak. They have lost only one game since October 21, 2007.

**STUDENT-ATHLETES:** D'Ortenzio, Hollinger, and te Boekhorst where all members of the Dean's honour list in 2006-2007.

**SNIPERS:** The Marauders were the most accurate shooting team in the OUA hitting 42.6% of the time

**NOTHING NEW:** The Maruders are making their third straight appearance at the CIS Championship. They have already played 4 of the 8 teams at this year's Championship with a record of 3-3. Eight current players where on the roster when McMaster played at the Saskatchewan exhibition tournament in 2005-2006 at the Physical Activity Complex.

**SENIOR LEADERSHIP:** The Marauders have seven seniors on their roster and all of them see time on the floor.

- Founded in 1887 with a \$900,000 bequest from Senator William McMaster, the first president of the Bank of Commerce, and his wife, Susan Moulton McMaster
- Moved to Hamilton in 1930
- University colours: maroon and grey (since 1912)

## OUR CAMPUS

- 300 acres of property at the western end of Lake Ontario
- 30-acre self-contained, pedestrian core
- Located within a quiet, residential neighbourhood
- Surrounded by natural attractions; access to 1,500 kms of hiking and biking trails

  - the “original six” ivy-covered stone buildings that formed the Hamilton campus’ core in 1930
