## **Regina Cougars: CIS Championship Preview**

The University of Regina's women's basketball team punched its ticket to the 2008 CIS Championship last Friday after defeating the No. 1-ranked Simon Fraser Clan by a score of 84-79 in the Canada West semifinals.

The win ensured that the Cougars would grab one of the conference's automatic berths to Saskatoon, as the top three teams at the Canada West Final Four all move on to the national tournament.

Though the Cougars went on to lose to UBC in the ensuing Canada West title game, Regina will make its eighth appearance in the CIS tournament in the past 11 seasons and its first since 2005.

Five Cougars enter the tournament with prior experience in a CIS championship. Maja Královcová (2004, 2005) is the only Regina player who has played in two national tournaments. Chelsea Cassano, Megan Cherkas, and Meryl Jordan were all part of the 2005 team that went 0-2 at the CIS tournament in Winnipeg, while Jacquie Kenyon was a member of Simon Fraser's 2004 squad that qualified for the big dance.

Guided by second-year head coach Dave Taylor, the Cougars were riding a 10-game winning streak until Saturday's 70-59 loss to UBC. Regina's 16-6 conference record is the school's best since the 2003-04 season, when the Cougars compiled a stellar 18-2 Canada West mark.

The Cougars ranked fourth in Canada West with an average of 74.6 points scored per game during the regular season, but no Regina player ranked in the top 25 in the conference in scoring. Led by Cassano's 10.2 points per game, five Cougars averaged between eight and 11 points and three more averaged between six and seven.

Despite coming off the bench and only averaging 20 minutes per game, Královcová leads the Cougars with 50 points in the team's first four playoff games. In addition to averaging 12.5 points per game in the postseason, she is also third on the team in rebounding and tied for second in blocks. Královcová, Jessica Lynch (12.0), Rebecca Schmidt (11.3), and Gabrielle Gheysen (11.3) are all averaging at least 10 points per game in the playoffs for Regina.

28 of Gheysen's 45 playoff points came in the Cougars' win over Simon Fraser. Her 28 points were the most in the playoffs by a Regina player since current assistant coach Cymone Bouchard scored 31 against Winnipeg in the 2004 CIS semifinals.

Regina enters the 2008 CIS Championship with an all-time record of 16-15 in their 11 national tournament appearances. The Cougars have advanced to the national title game on three separate occasions, losing in 1991 to Laurentian and in 2004 to UBC, and defeating Alberta in 2001.

## Coaching Staff

Dave Taylor was hired as the University of Regina's ninth women's basketball head coach on May 12, 2006.

The appointment of Taylor came as no surprise to anyone familiar with the Cougars. He joined Christine Stapleton's staff as an assistant coach beginning with the 1993-94 season and served as an assistant under both Stapleton and Jeff Speedy for 13 seasons before being named head coach following Speedy's departure to the University of New Brunswick.

The Cougars thrived during Taylor's time as assistant coach, as Regina won a national championship (2001) and four conference championships (1999, 2000, 2001, and 2004) and made seven appearances at the CIS tournament (1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2004, and 2005).

Taylor served as the head coach of the senior girls' basketball teams at Usher Collegiate (1992-93), Martin Collegiate (1993-94), and Sheldon-Williams Collegiate (1994-03 and 2005-06). He also spent eight seasons coaching numerous Saskatchewan provincial teams, including two Canada Summer Games squads.

Taylor inherited a young squad last year during his first season as head coach, guiding the squad to a 10-12 conference record that was followed by a loss in the playoffs to Manitoba.

This year has seen a spectacular turnaround for the Cougars, as the U of R has established itself as one of the premier women's basketball teams in the coun-

try. Regina will enter the CIS tournament ranked No. 5 in the CIS and winners of 10 of its past 11 games, including an upset of No. 1-ranked Simon Fraser in the Clan's gym during the Canada West Final Four last weekend.

With no fifth-year players, Taylor plans to return virtually his entire roster for the 2008-09 season as the Cougars prepare to host the CIS Championship for the first time in 30 years.

Cymone Bouchard is in her second year with the Cougars as an assistant coach after a prolific five-year playing career at the U of R that saw her win a national championship in 2001, a Nan Copp Award as the nation's most outstanding player, and two seasons as a CIS All-Canadian.

In his first season as an assistant under Taylor, Steve Burrows was seconded by the U of R and is utilized as an assistant coach by both the men's and women's teams. Burrows is also a physical education teacher at Campbell Collegiate in Regina and has been an assistant with the men's team for 11 seasons.
