1. Approval of the September 19th Conference Call Minutes

MOTION 1 (L. Moore/K. Schildroth)

Carried

To approve the September 19th conference call minutes as circulated and posted on the website.

2. CIS Curling Update

S. Newton reported that a questionnaire is being developed to circulate to the membership. This questionnaire would ask specific questions re the appetite of the membership to declare in the sport of curling for the 2007-2008 season or the 2008-2009 season or later. We can not move forward with approval of the draft playing regulations until it is confirmed whether the proposed format can be used (i.e. if there are no regional association championships then we may need to look at maintaining an open championship).

The Board of Directors will approve the questionnaire at their November face-to-face meeting. The questionnaire will be distributed to the membership so discussions can take place at the Regional Association meetings in January/February 2007.

3. CIS Championship Calendar

The committee reviewed Annex A. The discussion focused on the option of moving Men's Basketball to week 3 and/or moving Women's Basketball to week 4.

Discussion highlights:

- may need additional consultation with the women's basketball coaches association
- moving womens' basketball to week 4 puts them in conflict with the NCAA
- marketing feels the women's basketball fan base is different then the men's basketball fan base
- could look at leaving women's basketball on week 3 and having week 4 completely open
- agreed that 3 championships on one week is still a principle we need to apply
- can't move games to run Thursday to Saturday as this would hurt the hosts gate
- if the new format in women's basketball was to happen then moving the championship to week 4 would be necessary.
- could look at a Monday night final for women's basketball (wouldn't be up against NCAA)
- women's basketball being the only championship on that weekend could be a positive

MOTION 2 (P. Murray/A. Scott)

To approve the championship calendar with the recommendation to move men's basketball to week 3 and women's basketball to week 4 (with a Monday night final).

ACTION: Final proposal should be circulated to Sport Committee prior to distribution to the Board of Directors. To remain confidential until the Board approves (or otherwise) the recommendation.

Backgrounder for Sport Committee October 19, 2006 Conference Call

Agenda Item c)

Desired outcome: For the committee to discuss and agree on a final recommendation to forward to the Board of Directors on the placement of the Men's Basketball Championship in the overall CIS Championship Calendar.

Background: Sport Committee requested feedback from the membership at the June 2006 AGM re the dates of the Men's and Women's Basketball Championship. Below is an excerpt from the minutes of the June 2006 AGM. Also attached is a copy of the report presented to the membership prior to the meeting. The Board of Directors is looking to discuss this item at their November face-to-face meeting.

June 2006 AGM Minutes

The optimal schedule for men's & women's basketball remains the outstanding item to be addressed as part of the overall national schedule.

The Sport Committee discussed recommendations from the men's basketball coaches association to see the men's championship move from week 4 to week 3 in order to move away from the NCAA championship broadcasts. This concept has received support from the Marketing Committee although couched with a statement that a change cannot guarantee an automatic increase in viewership, simply create opportunities for a possible increase in viewerships.

The committee discussed concerns regarding the ability for the CIS to grow the number of televised games by having the two (2) basketball championships on the same weekend. As well, Members cautioned the Committee to be aware of unintended consequences of a move in dates, i.e. the impact on women's championships needs to be factored into the decision making.

The suggested sequence for a Membership vote is as follows:

1. Do you favour having both the men's and the women's championship on week 3?
 - a. Yes go to question 2
 - b. No, go to question 3
2. Do you favour moving the men's ice hockey championship to week 4?
3. Do you favour having the men's championship move to week 3 and the women's championship to week 4?

To host both the men's and the women's championship on week 3 of the CIS Championship Schedule.

Based on the results of the vote, the Sport Committee is struggling with the next step and requested the feedback and guidance of the Membership.

It was suggested that perhaps we decide what to do with the Men's Basketball Championship first, then develop a strategy for the rest of the sports.

A straw vote was taken on the following question:

Would you support a move of the Men's Basketball Championship off week 4 to week 3. Forty four members supported this move and twenty eight members were opposed.

Original report presented to the membership prior to the AGM:

Thank you to the committee members for their on-going work on several projects. A special thank you to Sheila-Ann and the national office staff for their efforts in making our decision-making easier through good information and preparation.

The Sport Committee met on six (6) occasions via conference call and one face to face. Copies of Sport Committee Minutes are on the CIS web site:

By far, the most time consuming and debated items have been the reformatting of the men's basketball championship and the overall CIS national championship schedule. The national championships schedule has been on the Sport Committee's agenda for the past 3 years without any resolution. The Sport Committee will be looking to secure direction from the membership in June on two specific items which will bring closure to this task and allow the committee to move forward with the implementation of the new schedule.

To ensure our debate is focused and leads to an outcome, the Sport Committee felt it was important to provide each member with background information and rationale for the consensus it has reached and to clearly identify the two (2) questions which shall be posed to the membership.

Consensus:

In reviewing the spring championship schedule, the committee remained committed to the scheduling principals listed in 20.30.3. The committee was also very sensitive to the need to maximize our profile in the media and sport community by utilizing all 5 championship weekends (last weekend of Feb to the fourth weekend in March).

With these items in mind, the committee agreed on the following schedule for 8 of our 10 championships.

For Membership Input:

The optimal schedule for men's & women's basketball remains the outstanding items to be addressed as part of this overall national schedule.

The committee discussed recommendations from the men's basketball coaches association to see the men's championship move from week 4 to week 3 in order to move away from the NCAA championship broadcasts. This concept has received support from the Marketing Committee although couched with a statement that a change cannot guarantee an automatic increase in viewership, simply create opportunities for a possible increase in viewships.

The committee discussed concerns regarding the ability for the CIS to grow the number of televised games by having the two (2) basketball championships on the same weekend. As well what the affect of moving the women's basketball to the week 4 may have on the championship.

It is for this reason that we will be taking the following questions to the membership on the floor of the assembly. Members will be asked in June to vote on the following options:

4. Do you favour having both the men's and the women's championship on week 3?
 - a. Yes go to question 2
 - b. No, go to question 3
5. Do you favour moving the men's ice hockey championship to week 4?
6. Do you favour having the men's championship move to week 3 and the women's championship to week 4?

Members will hear from both the Sport Committee and Marketing Committee during the Issue Preparation and Discussion Session and shall have the opportunity to discuss the above options prior to moving into the assembly for a vote during the Sport Committee report.

Following the AGM, the Sport Committee will complete the national championships schedule and prepare a transition plan for possible implementation in 2008-09 for the July 2006 Board of Directors meeting for approval as per CIS Policy 20.30.3.1.1.

60.10.1 CANADIAN INTERUNIVERSITY SPORT HONOURS - GENERAL

Outstanding achievements or performances by individuals, teams, individual institutions and/or Regional Associations in interuniversity sports shall be officially recognized by Canadian Interuniversity Sport. Public commendations for superior accomplishments/performances acknowledges the efforts of the recipients, may serve to motivate others to aspire to similar success, and tends to reinforce a fundamental premise of universities, eg. the pursuit of excellence.

60.10.2 Outstanding accomplishments which exemplified the ideals and purposes of interuniversity athletics and amateur sport shall be officially recognized by public commendations by Canadian Interuniversity Sport.

60.60.1 GENERAL

These awards need not be presented annually. The Canadian Interuniversity Sport Office will circulate a nomination form for all Special Awards to each Member institutions, and nominations must be supported by a minimum of two Canadian Interuniversity Sport Member Institutions.

60.60.2 SPORTS HALL OF FAME

The Canadian Interuniversity Sport shall nominate a candidate (when deemed worthy) to Canada's Sports Hall of Fame.

60.60.3 FRED SGAMBATI MEDIA AWARD

60.60.3.1 General

Presented to a member of the news media who has made a major contribution to the development and growth of Canadian university sport. Fred Sgambati was a well respected reporter/broadcaster who was a great supporter of university athletics in Canada. A former University of Toronto athlete and university football official, Fred Sgambati was the radio voice of the College Bowl (now the Vanier Cup) for its first thirteen years.

60.60.3.2 Selection Process

60.60.3.2.1 The call for nominations shall go out 90 days prior to the Annual General Meeting.

60.60.3.2.2 Nominations must be submitted in writing on the appropriate nomination form 45 days prior to the Annual General Meeting.

- 60.60.3.2.3 Nominations must include a detailed description of the nominee's accomplishments and contributions as well as a brief biography.
- 60.60.3.2.4 Nominations must be supported by a minimum of two (2) Canadian Interuniversity Sport Member Institutions.
- 60.60.3.2.5 The selection committee will be composed of the Vice President Marketing, Director of Marketing, and the Chair of the Committee of Marketing and Sports Information Directors.

60.60.3.3 Presentation

Presentation of this award will be made at the Annual General Meeting or at another appropriate time and location as determined by the Selection Committee.

The expenses for the recipient to attend the award shall be covered by the recipient or the nominator.

60.60.4 AUSTIN MATTHEWS AWARD

60.60.4.1 General

This award shall be presented annually to an individual who has made an outstanding contribution to interuniversity sport as demonstrated by his/her long term commitment and leadership as a director, chairperson and/or executive committee member at the local, provincial and/or national levels of Canadian interuniversity sport.

60.60.4.2 Selection Process

- 60.60.4.2.1 The call for nominations shall go out 90 days prior to the Annual General Meeting.
- 60.60.4.2.2 Nominations must be submitted in writing on the appropriate nomination form 45 days prior to the Annual General Meeting.
- 60.60.4.2.3 Nominations must include a detailed description of the nominee's accomplishments and contributions as well as a brief biography.
- 60.60.4.2.4 Nominations must be supported by a minimum of two (2) Canadian Interuniversity Sport Members.
- 60.60.4.2.5 Names of previous nominees will remain on file for future selections.
- 60.60.4.2.6 A committee composed of the Vice President Research and Development, Vice President Sport and Vice President Marketing shall review the nominations and select the recipient.

60.60.4.3 Presentation

Presentation of this award will be made at the Annual General Meeting or at another appropriate time and location as determined by the Selection Committee.

The expenses for the recipient to attend the award shall be covered by the recipient or the nominator.

60.60.5 THE L.B. "MIKE" PEARSON AWARD

60.60.5.1 General

This award shall be presented to a distinguished Canadian citizen of outstanding achievements, who having participated in interuniversity athletics has by his/her personal accomplishments exemplified the ideals and purposes of interuniversity athletics and amateur sport.

60.60.5.2 Selection Process

- 60.60.5.2.1 The call for nominations shall go out 90 days prior to the Canadian Interuniversity AGM.
- 60.60.5.2.2 Nominations must be submitted in writing on the appropriate nomination form 45 days prior to the Canadian Interuniversity Sport AGM.
- 60.60.5.2.3 Nominations must include a detailed description of the nominee's accomplishments and contributions as well as a brief biography.
- 60.60.5.2.4 Nominations must be supported by a minimum of two (2) Canadian Interuniversity Sport Members.
- 60.60.5.2.5 Names of previous nominees will remain on file for future selections.
- 60.60.5.2.6 A committee composed of the Past President or President Elect, a Canadian Interuniversity Sport member appointed by the CIS President, a Canadian Interuniversity Sport Office Staff (non-voting) and up to three (3) corporate and/or Community representatives appointed by the CIS President shall review the nominations. One of the five committee members must be a female.

60.60.5.3 Presentation

Presentation of this award will be made at a time and location as determined by the Selection Committee.

The expenses for the recipient to attend the award shall be covered by the recipient or the nominator.

60.60.6 CIS COACHING AWARD

60.60.6.1 General

This award shall be presented annually to an individual who has made an outstanding contribution to interuniversity sport as demonstrated by his/her long term commitment and leadership as a coach at the local, provincial, national and/or international levels of Canadian interuniversity sport.

60.60.6.2 Selection Process

60.60.6.2.1 The call for nominations shall go out ~~90~~ 90 days prior to the Annual General Meeting.

60.60.6.2.2 Nominations must be submitted in writing on the appropriate nomination form ~~45~~ 45 days prior to the Annual General Meeting.

60.60.6.2.3 Nominations must include a detailed description of the nominee's accomplishments and contributions as well as a brief biography.

60.60.6.2.4 Nominations must be supported by a minimum of two (2) Canadian Interuniversity Sport Members.

60.60.6.2.5 Names of previous nominees will remain on file for future selections.

60.60.6.2.6 A committee composed of the Vice President Research and Development, Vice President Sport and Vice President Marketing shall review the nominations and select the recipient. ~~A committee composed of the Vice President Research and Development, Vice President Sport and Vice President Marketing shall review the nominations and select the recipient.~~

60.60.6.3 Presentation

Presentation of this award will be made at the Annual General Meeting or at another appropriate time and location as determined by the Selection Committee.

The expenses for the recipient to attend the award shall be covered by the recipient or the nominator.

60.60.6.4 AWARDS PRESENTED BY OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

Canadian Interuniversity Sport shall nominate a candidate(s) (when deemed worthy) for awards presented by National Sport Organizations, Multi-Sport Organizations, or other Agencies.

60.70.1 TITLES

As per Article 10 of the Canadian Interuniversity Sport By-laws, title to the trophies shall remain with Canadian Interuniversity Sport.

60.70.2 NAMING OF CIS HONOURS

60.70.2.1 Canadian Interuniversity Sport is committed to recognizing outstanding accomplishments which exemplify the ideals and purposes of interuniversity athletics and amateur sport.

60.70.2.2 The creation of new Canadian Interuniversity Sport honours shall rest with the Board of Directors. Such awards shall be named after outstanding individuals who exemplify the selection criteria of the award and shall automatically assure their nomination-selection as the inaugural recipient.

60.70.2.3 Members and/or committees may submit at any time to the Board of Directors selection criteria for the establishment of new awards. Proposals for the creation of an honour, which is not sport specific in nature, shall include (i) the purpose of the award, (ii) the selection criteria, and (iii) selection process. The proposals shall be reviewed by the Board of Directors.

60.70.2.4 Once an award is approved, the Board of Directors shall circulate the award purpose, selection criteria and process to the membership along with a request for inaugural recipient(s) after whom the award shall be named. Should the founder of the award have submitted a proposed name, this information along with the above information shall be circulated to the members. The Board of Directors shall hold the final decision on the naming of the award.

60.70.2.5 Renaming of current awards

Awards currently in existence can be renamed by the Board of Directors using the process outlined in 60.70.2.4 with the consent of the original award sponsor(s)/donor(s).

60.70.3 ENGRAVING

60.70.3.1 Championship Trophies

Engraving of Championship Trophies shall be the responsibility of the Championship Winner. In the event that the winning institution does not update the trophy, the following host will ensure the information is added and invoice the institution in question.

60.70.3.2 Individual perpetual trophies

Engraving of individual perpetual trophies will be the responsibility of the host with the exception of those trophies where the recipient is selected on-site less than 24 hours prior to the presentation of the award. Under these circumstances, the recipient's institution will be responsible for updating the information on the trophy.

60.70.3.3 Keeper trophies/awards

Engraving of keeper trophies/awards will be the responsibility of the host with the exception of those trophies where the recipient is selected on-site less than 24 hours prior to the presentation of the award. Under these circumstances the recipient's institution will be responsible for updating the information on the trophy.

60.70.4 PRESENTATION/DISPLAY

60.70.4.1 Championship trophies

Championship trophies are presented to the winning team, whose university is permitted to display the trophy for a period of approximately one year.

60.70.4.2 Individual perpetual trophies

Individual trophies are presented to the winner, whose university is permitted to display the trophy for a period of approximately one year. Exception: The following individual Men's Football trophies are not released to the winner and are retained by the Championship Host:

J. P. Metras Trophy
President's Trophy
Peter Gorman Trophy
Ted Morris Trophy

Bruce Coulter Trophy
Frank Tindall Trophy

60.70.5 SAFEKEEPING/DAMAGES

Universities in possession of any Canadian Interuniversity Sport trophy(ies) are responsible for the safe keeping of the trophy(ies) (Article 11, Canadian Interuniversity Sport By-Laws). Repair costs for damages will be invoiced to the institution in question.

60.70.6 TRANSPORTATION/DELIVERY

Universities in possession of Canadian Interuniversity Sport trophy(ies) are responsible for the delivery of the trophy(ies) to the Host Organizing Committee of the next championship (Article 11, Canadian Interuniversity Sport By-laws). These trophies shall be returned/delivered on the date requested by the Organizing Committee.

Policies and Procedures 60 – Honours
