Senator Joseph A. Sullivan Trophy (Player of the year) / Trophée du Sénateur Joseph A. Sullivan (Joueur de l'année)

The Sullivan Trophy was first awarded in 1975-76. A former player with the University of Toronto Varsity Blues, Joseph A. Sullivan was the goaltender for the University of Toronto "Grads", which won the gold medal for Canada at the 1928 Olympic Winter Games in St. Moritz, Switzerland. The trophy was formerly presented for Canadian University Hockey competition, but was rededicated in 1976. The recipient is selected by a committee of coaches representing the CIS three regional associations.
